Brittannia

The Romans invaded Britain over 2,000 years ago. They called the country Brittannia and stayed for about 400 years. The Romans changed a lot of things in the country, and we can see the changes in British life today.

Some English words come from the Roman language, Latin, for example, autumn, habitat and alien. The Roman emperor Julius Caesar started today's calendar. Later, they used his name for the seventh month, July, because he was born in that month.

There weren't many towns in Britain before the Roman invasion, and the Romans started a lot of new cities and towns. We live in these cities now, but we call them different names; Roman Londinium is now London and Mamucium is Manchester. York was a very important town in Roman times. They called it Eboracum. Today, people in this city have a Roman festival every year to celebrate their Roman history.

The Romans liked having a bath, and there were public baths in some of the cities. You can visit the Roman baths today – in Bath! The Romans also invented roads, and modern roads in Britain follow the old Roman roads in a lot of places.
